

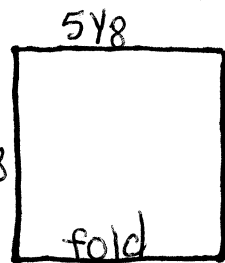
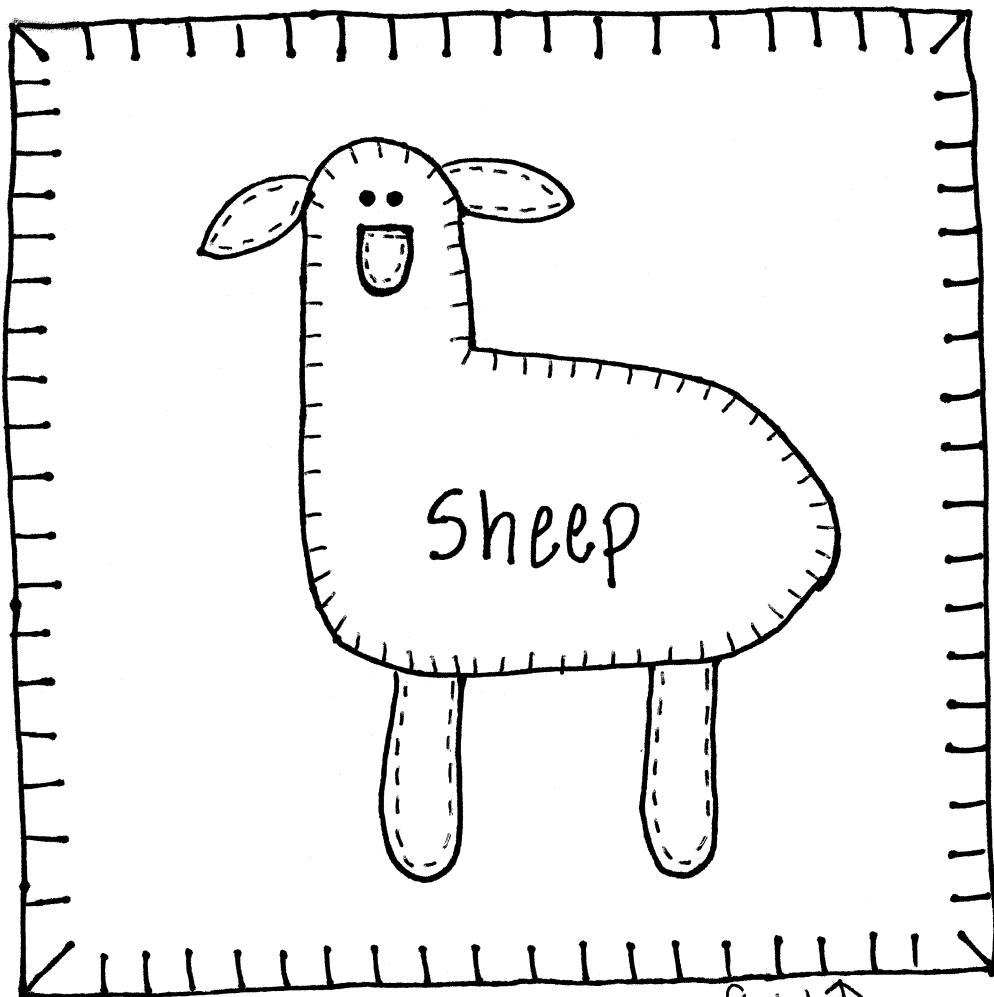

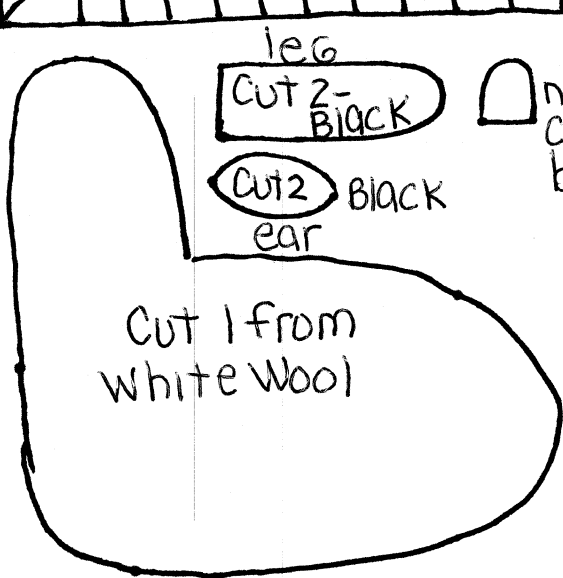
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Cut 1 Wool
BACKING on
fold
5 1/8" x 5 1/8"

- Cut wool backing
- Cut out all sheep parts
- Center sheep on 5 1/8 x 5 1/8 square
- pin pieces (through 1 layer of fabric)
- be sure fold is AT bottom
- Sew a blanket stitch around sheep
- Sew a running stitch around legs, ears, nose
- make french knots for eyes
- with black floss back stitch either "Sheep" or "Wool" on sheep's body



Sheep
WOOL

- Put wood lid in between fabric,
- whip stitch edges together, pull tightly.
- Sew a blanket stitch around edges

Attach hinges on box lid before stitching
front to back.
after blanket stitching attach hinges to box
